

PROCEEDINGS OF THE MEETING OF THE STATE LEVEL SANCTIONING COMMITTEE HELD UNDER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF SHRI DHARAM VIR, IAS, CHIEF SECRETARY, HARYANA ON 3.7.2009 AT 3.00 PM FOR APPROVAL OF PROJECTS UNDER RASHTRIYA KRISHI VIKAS YOJNA (RKVY) FOR THE YEAR 2009-10

At the outset, the Financial Commissioner & Principal Secretary, Agriculture welcomed the chairman and other members of the committee. He informed that Rs. 96.91crore had been allocated by Govt. of India under the RKVY to the State. He also informed that this also included the committed liabilities of the previous year. He further informed that the project proposals of Rs. 176.48 crore had been received from different departments. Agenda items were discussed as under:-

The proceedings were confirmed. The representative of Govt. of India said that subsidy should not exceed 50% in any project not started so far. Additional subsidy, if required, may be given out of State funds.
